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

- Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2009, Section 563
 - The Department must implement a ***centralized, case-level sexual assault database*** by January 14, 2010
 - The Department will use the database to develop and implement congressional reports
- Current implement policy issuance for DSAID is DoD Instruction 6495.02, Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program Procedures
- DSAID contains data for each Unrestricted and Restricted report covered under DoD SAPR policy:
 - Include Service members, Dependents 18 years and older, etc.
 - Does not include data on sexual assault cases involving spouses, intimate partners, or dependents under 18 years of age




