



FY14 Court-Martial Outcomes (Sexual Assault Offense)





FY14 Outcomes (Non-Sexual Assault Offense)




*The outcomes for the attempts to commit cases were: 1 charges dismissed; 1 convicted of a non-sexual assault offense; 1 RILO/DILO

- In FY14, while most subjects charged with a sexual assault offense were convicted of some offense at court-martial, the most serious charge upon which they were convicted varied.
- Overall:
 - For 133 subjects, the most serious charge convicted was a penetrating offense.
 - For 108 subjects, the most serious charge convicted was a sexual contact offense.
 - For 192 subjects, the most serious charge convicted was some other charge.


Court-Martial Charges Preferred for Sexual Assault Charge








FY12 Court-Martial Outcomes (Sexual Assault Offense)





NJP Outcomes (Sexual Assault Offense)



FY12 Non-sexual assault offenses









FY13 Court-Martial Outcomes (Sexual Assault Offense)
