

# Staff Summary of Reading Materials for JPP Members in Preparation for the November 6th Public Meeting

## **A. Materials Relevant to Courts-Martial Data Analysis**

### **1. Court-Martial Process Flow Chart (1 page)**

This quick-reference chart, prepared by the JPP Staff, serves to guide the discussion about military case processing and decisions regarding disposition and punishment.

### **2. Article 120 Offense Guide (1 page)**

This quick-reference chart, prepared by the JPP Staff, lists the various offenses under the three versions of Article 120 of the UCMJ.

### **3. Executive Summary – JPP Review of Data and Trends (2 pages)**

Describes the JPP's court-martial trend analysis tasks and the staff's review of the data requirements and sources to accomplish those tasks. It also explains the information the JPP staff requested from the Services and the status of its data collection efforts to date.

## **B. Materials Relevant to Testimony Presented by Witnesses at the October 9th JPP Meeting Concerning Courts-Martial Sentencing and Military Justice Data Management**

### **4. 18 U.S.C. § 3553(a) (4 pages)**

This statute lays out the factors to be considered by federal district court judges in determining a sentence for all federal crimes, to include the federal sentencing guidelines, the overarching sentencing goals, and the nature and characteristics of both the particular offense and offender. During the October 9 meeting, Mr. Steve Grocki, a federal prosecutor, cited this statute as providing useful guidelines to prosecutors and judges in arriving at sentences for federal sex crimes.

### **5. The Department of Defense Family Advocacy Program (FAP) Fiscal Year 2014 Data (37 pages)**

Provides aggregate statistics regarding the reports of domestic abuse and child abuse and neglect received by the Family Advocacy Program offices throughout the DoD for fiscal year 2014. The FAP data includes reports of sexual abuse within its domestic abuse statistics.

### **6. Department of Defense Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Office (SAPRO) Statistics Regarding Adjudication Outcomes for Fiscal Years 2012, 2013, and 2014 (18 pages)**
