

1. Thank you for the opportunity to address the Panel's questions concerning Victims' Legal Counsel Organization (VLCO) program information and Special Victim Investigation and Prosecution (SVIP) data. The enclosure contains the requested tables.

2. Concerning the requested information, the Marine Corps recently developed a paralegal program that requires our legal service specialists to complete a two-year degree at an accredited institution to receive a designation as a paralegal, with a follow-on assignment to a Regional Trial Counsel Office. Since this is a new program, we have not yet graduated our first paralegal and we do not have any responsive data. In the coming year, the Marine Corps will place SVIP paralegals in our Regional Trial Counsel offices.
