REQUEST FOR INFORMATION SET # 5**

97. Services: In response to JPP RFI # 71, several Services noted that if any incidents of retaliation are reported to the CMG Chair, the commander concerned will develop a plan to immediately address the issue and will forward the plan to the CMG Chair. Please provide three written examples of plans commanders briefed to CMG Chairs to address retaliation complaints in sexual assault cases. (Please redact names of the parties involved.)

USAF	(AF/CVS) Air Force commanders do not typically produce a written plan in each case. However, commanders are required to brief their plan and status of any investigation at the monthly CMG meeting. The commander will continue to update the CMG each month until the case is closed. See TAB 3. ENCLOSURE: Tab 3, CVS 75 ABW Retaliation Example
USN	Navy is not aware of any written plans or of any requirement for such.
USMC	The Marine Corps has not implemented a formal, standardized format pending final recommendations from the Retaliation Working Group. Currently, information is being tracked as part of the Case Management Group meeting notes in the format preferred by the CMG Chair. The three examples at enclosure (5) are templates utilized by Marine Corps installations to record and track responses. USCG	The Coast Guard's CITs do not specifically track retaliation related to sexual assault cases.
