The Thirteenth Public Meeting of the Judicial Proceedings Panel will be held on September 18, 2015 in Arlington, Virginia.

Arlington, VA - The thirteenth public meeting of the Judicial Proceedings Panel (“JPP” or “the Panel”) will be held on Friday, September 18, 2015, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at The Holiday Inn Arlington at Ballston, 4610 N. Fairfax Drive, Arlington, Virginia 22203.

The Judicial Proceedings Panel was established by the Secretary of Defense in June 2014 in accordance with section 576(a)(2) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013. The Judicial Proceedings Panel is an independent federal advisory committee tasked to conduct an independent review and assessment of military judicial proceedings for sexual assault offenses since Fiscal Year 2012, for the purpose of developing recommendations to Congress and the Secretary of Defense for improvements to such proceedings.

In morning sessions, the Panel will continue its deliberation on issues relating to restitution and compensation for sexual assault victims as well as retaliation against individuals who report incidents of sexual assault within the military. In the afternoon, the Panel will begin its review of the disposition of sexual assault crimes in the military judicial system. The Panel will first hear from criminologists and experts from the U.S. Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Statistics and the U.S. Sentencing Commission about crime data collection and analysis in various civilian jurisdictions. Then the Panel will hear about data collection in the Department of Defense from the leaders of the Department of Defense Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Office. The meeting will conclude with time reserved for public comment.

The Panel welcomes input from the public on topics of this meeting or other issues considered by the Panel.
