

**JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS PANEL  
REQUEST FOR INFORMATION SET # 1**

**43. Services: If tracked, please provide metrics and data on:**

**a. SVC utilization rate for victims making restricted reports.**

<b>USA</b>	The Army does not track this data.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014. 139 restricted reports total since program inception.
<b>USN</b>	There is currently no data for this metric; however, as of September 2014 approximately 6% of VLC clients had filed a Restricted Report. In FY14, 74 of 275 (27%) victims making restricted reports utilized VLC services.
<b>USMC</b>	Between 1 November 2013 and 24 October 2014, 35 victims with restricted reports of sexual assault consulted with VLC.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.

**b. SVC utilization rate for victims making unrestricted reports.**

<b>USA</b>	The Army does not track this data.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014. 1023 unrestricted reports total since program inception. 621 Active Cases (average 23 clients per SVC) with a peak of 37 clients for a seasoned SVC and minimum of 15 clients for a newly-trained SVC.
<b>USN</b>	There is currently no data for this metric; however, as of September 2014 approximately 90% of VLC clients had filed an Unrestricted Report. In FY14, 663 of 860 (77%) victims making unrestricted reports utilized VLC services.
<b>USMC</b>	Between 1 November 2013 and 24 October 2014, 324 victims with unrestricted reports of sexual assault consulted with VLC.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.

**c. Conversion rates for victims who have made restricted reports (for both those represented by an SVC and those not represented).**

<b>USA</b>	The Army does not track this data.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014. 139 restricted reports, 63 clients converted to non-restricted after consulting an SVC (45%).
<b>USN</b>	There is insufficient information to specifically answer this question; however, as of September 2014, 17 victims converted from Restricted to Unrestricted reporting after meeting with a VLC.
<b>USMC</b>	For victims with VLC: 29 of 52 victims with unreported or restricted reports of sexual assault converted to unrestricted reports after consultation with VLC. Note that victims who desire to know their rights, but maintain a restricted report, are not pressured to convert to unrestricted reports.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.

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**d. Dropout rate for victims participating in investigations and/or courts-martial (for both those represented by an SVC and those not represented).**

<b>USA</b>	In FY13, 58 Victims declined to cooperate with the military justice system resulting in no action taken against the Subject. None of these Victims were represented by Special Victim Counsel as the program was not yet in existence. Fiscal year 2014 data is not yet available, but the data will not track whether Victims who "drop out" were represented by counsel.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014. 541 cases terminated, 148 clients declined to participate in investigations and/or courts-martial (27%)
<b>USN</b>	There is currently no data for this metric.
<b>USMC</b>	While the Marine Corps does not track victim declination for those represented by an VLC and those not represented, the Defense Sexual Assault Incident Database tracks victim declination overall. DSAID data indicates that the number of victims declining to participate in the military justice process in the Marine Corps has decreased from 16% in FY11 down to 8% in FY14.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.

**e. Reenlistment rates for victims making restricted and unrestricted reports (for both those represented by an SVC and those not represented).**

<b>USA</b>	The Army does not track this data. No data will be available for restricted reports as the personally identifying information is not known to the Army.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014. There is no data available from the SVC for reenlistment rates of clients.
<b>USN</b>	There is currently no data for this metric.
<b>USMC</b>	The Marine Corps does not track this data.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.

**f. Location and staffing of SVC offices versus frequency of restricted and unrestricted reports.**

<b>USA</b>	The Army does not track this data. No data will be available for restricted reports as the personally identifying information is not known to the Army.
<b>USAF</b>	The following data is current as of 24 October 2014.  See attached document showing SVC office locations versus frequency of restricted and unrestricted reports. (Atch 43.1).  <b>ATTACHMENT: Atch 43.1 – SVC Office Locations vs. Restricted/Unrestricted Report Frequency</b>
<b>USN</b>	Navy VLC is located in fleet concentration areas based on historical case data of sexual assault reporting and VLC staffing is apportioned to best meet the needs of victims. For example, Norfolk and San Diego, the two biggest fleet concentration areas, each have four VLC while smaller bases may have one or two VLC. The

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	apportionment of VLC will be reviewed annually to ensure the VLC program continues to best represent the needs of victims.
<b>USMC</b>	The Marine Corps does not track this data.
<b>USCG</b>	This information is not tracked at this time.
